

#### LONGITUDINAL CEDAR STRIP CONSTRUTION




The "All-Wood" boats listed in the outboard motor section as well as some of our rowing skiffs and canoes, are built by the superior and time-tested method known as "Longitudinal Cedar Strip" construction. The planking, of carefully selected and properly seasoned cedar, is laid lengthwise in narrow strips not over two inches wide. These strips have a ship-lap or half checked joint on each edge, are gummed at both joints and then fitted up tightly so as to make a smooth outside surface. The ribs or frames, half round for neatness and weight reduction, are spaced closely. In the majority of outboard boats, they are spaced 3" from centre to centre, while in rowing skiffs and canoes they are spaced 2" to 3" centres depending on the quality. To these ribs the planking is fastened securely with large head

copper nails, drawn up tightly and clinched on the inside of boat. The keel, stem, transom, gunwales, etc., are of selected oak.

The outstanding feature of this method of construction, is requisite strength with minimum weight and the pleasing absence of leaks due to the fact that the narrow planks do not shrink or swell to any noticeable extent when unduly exposed to the weather. "CANADIAN" boats have been constructed this way for many years and boats over 20 years old are still giving satisfactory service.

#### CANVAS COVERED CONSTRUCTION



Canvas Covered Construction properly carried out produces tough, serviceable boats. They are not effected by weather changes, do not absorb moisture, and therefore do not gain in weight.

The planking and ribs which comprise the shell are of selected cedar, a tough, durable wood which for light boat building is superior to any other. The planking is fastened with brass tacks to the ribs, which are thicker than the planking, and placed fairly close together. Over this shell a piece of seamless canvas is stretched and this is treated with a special preparation which is rubbed well into the canvas. The boats are put away until the filler dries. This operation is very important for unless the right materials are used for filling

and the filler properly applied and dried hard before painting, the canoe will not have a wearing surface that will stand up under hard usage, or resist the affects of exposure. The filler is covered with best quality paint.

#### GUARANTEE

Every care is taken in the manufacture of "Canadian" boats and canoes which are guaranteed against defective materials and workmanship. All replacements of parts are made f.o.b. factory Peterborough, Ontario. If a purchaser obtains a "Canadian" boat or canoe that he feels is not perfect we urge prompt indication to the factory.


Any canoe when properly handled is safe, but the additional carrying capacity of a "Sponson" canoe makes it ideal for family use or a real aid to beginners and inexperienced paddlers.

When the load is sufficient to bring the Sponsons down to the water they act as supports and provide that extra buoyancy. The Sponsons are air-chambers built along each side of the canoe just under the gunwales.

Considerable pressure is required to submerge these air-chambers and as a canoe cannot capsize without the gunwales going under only a deliberate attempt will turn the canoe over. Even when filled with water the Sponson canoe will support more persons than can regularly sit in it. Painted red or green outside with Sponson tops opposite colors. Varnished inside. Equipped with 2 paddles.

For those whose requirements call for something more adaptable to one-man use we offer the 4 Trapper models. Of "Canvas covered" construction they are painted outside in the flat finish and varnished natural inside.


The No. 95 is designed to meet the demands for a light canoe with a fair carrying capacity. The weight is reduced by using lighter ribs and canvas (No. 10) and it should therefore be given more careful handling. A keel is part of the standard equipment on this model only. Varnished inside and painted outside in flat finish.

These canoes are popular for canoe trips and are used by forest rangers. Of "canvas covered construction" with ribs  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " apart they are a safe canoe built to withstand abuse. They are varnished natural inside and finished outside in Flat Grey paint.






Superior strength and greater carrying capacity are the special features of these canoes. Of "canvas covered construction" in these models heavier canvas is used, the ribs also are heavier and closer together, making a very strong canoe. A heavy keel is regular equipment. Model No. 74 is equipped with three bilge-keels each side of keel as standard equipment.



## Canadian CARE OF YOUR BOAT

FALL LAY-A-WAY — When your boating season is over the time has arrived to give your boat a thorough cleaning. Wash it out inside free of all dirt, grease and sand and also remove from outside all similar foreign matters. If this is done in the Fall much better results can be obtained with less work than leaving this clean out until the Spring when the dirt and grease has hardened. Actual revarnishing and repainting of the boat is best left until the Spring.

Store your boat properly leaving it well supported evenly and in such a manner that long storage will not change its shape. Outboard boats and canoes are best stored bottom side up and in areas where air circulates freely. Great care should be taken not to store in exceptionally hot places.

SPRING LAUNCHING — If your boat has been properly laid away as recommended in the foregoing paragraph it is only necessary to wipe it off to remove accumulating dust before applying a new finish. However, annual revarnishing or repainting is not advisable unless the finish is such that this is necessary. If your boat has had exceptionally good care and the finish is as good as new applying new paint or varnish only increases the depth and consequently, cracks in the finish will develop. Therefore, it is advisable to attempt to remove by light sanding as much of the finish as you intend to apply.

After your boat is prepared for varnishing it is advisable to apply in deep scratches or gouges a filling material such as plastic wood. Brush on a thin coat of varnish or paint as it is much better to apply two thin coats of material than one thick coat. If more than one coat is applied sand lightly with fine sand paper between each coat. Varnish or paint should be brushed out well and care taken to brush it well into any open cracks. The work should be done in a shady position and in a temperature of 60 to 80 degrees. Always use the best grade Marine varnish or finish and use good brushes.

OPERATIONAL CARE — Much longer life can be given to the average boat if care in operation is used. The phrase "Common Sense Afloat" must surely be applied from a safety angle but it can also be applied to the care of your boat and for your guidance, we list a few "don'ts" that if followed will enable your boat to give longer and better service.

Don't — Allow water to remain in a boat pulled up on the shore.

Don't - Strain a boat by pulling it out of the water when there is water in it.

Don't — Leave a boat exposed to the hot sun when not in the water.

Don't — Let scratches in the finish and bare material go unprotected until the end of the season.

Don't - Walk or sit in a small boat or canoe if not in the water.

Don't - Wear high heeled shoes or shoes with heavy nails protruding.

Don't — Drag your boat over the shore.

Don't — Leave dirt and sand in your boat.
